

2021 Year 12 Graduates Pathway Success

On 14 January 156/172 students (both domestic (149) and International (7) students received an offer for a course at a university. A brief analysis showed that:

- 91% of VTAC applicants received and offer (156/172) in the first round. February rounds so far have seen more offers occuring.
- 92% of VTAC applicants received their 1st, 2nd or 3rd preference (144/156)
- 69% received a 1st preference offer
- 16% received a 2nd preference offer
- 7% received a 3rd preference offer

Number (TFN)

Any student will need at tax file number if he/she starts work (part-time and full-time) and all students planning on a tertiary education require one when they start.

Importantly, current Year 12 students are reminded that they cannot enrol in a CSP (Commonwealth Support Place) course at university without a Tax File Number, so it is worthwhile getting an application submitted early!

Students must apply for a TFN online and have their identity verified through an interview at a participating Australia Post office.

The Hansen Scholarship 2023

The *Hansen Scholarship Program* was first introduced in 2020, and it offers 20 talented students from around Australia a generous package of accommodation, financial support, mentoring and pastoral care.

Selection is based on:

- Track record of academic excellence and a commitment to academic success in university studies
- Demonstrated ability to achieve success in the face of adversity and overcome obstacles
- Demonstrated ability to apply skills and strengths towards activities which benefit others
- Demonstrated ability to work effectively in a team and lead those around you
- Likelihood of thriving as a Hansen Scholar and actively contributing to the Hansen Scholarship Program

Benefits of the scholarship include -

- A standard room for 48 weeks each year, at no charge, for the standard full-time, three-year undergraduate degree at Little Hall residence in Lincoln Square South An allowance of \$4000 per year for general living expenses for the standard full-time duration of the undergraduate degree
- Full fee remission for asylum seekers who would otherwise have to pay international fees
- A one-time grant of up to \$4000 to support an approved activity for the Scholar's development such as an international exchange, an international subject, an internship or similar role
- Access to a mentoring program, pastoral care, and development programs available to all students at Little Hall as well as a tailored program of mentoring and support exclusively for Hansen Scholars
- Priority access to graduate accommodation at Little Hall should the Hansen Scholar wish to pursue graduate studies at Melbourne after completing their undergraduate degree
- Next steps funding after completion of the scholar's undergraduate degree (competitive process to apply for up to \$10,000 for a short-term activity or up to \$20,000 for further study)
- From 2022, students who meet the requirements for the Melbourne Chancellor's Scholarship will receive the Melbourne Chancellor's Scholarship Guaranteed Commonwealth Supported Place in one of the professional master's degrees for students who meet the prerequisite course and entry requirements for the master's degree

Applications open on 7 February 2022, and close on 9 March 2022.

Tuckwell Scholarship for 2023

Australian National University (ANU) launched the *Tuckwell Scholarship Program* in 2013. *The Tuckwell Scholarship Program at the ANU is the most transformational undergraduate scholarship program in Australia*. A Tuckwell is not just about a students' intellect. It is also about their desire and determination to use their natural abilities to realise their full potential so that they can make a difference in the world. All up one could say, **this is no ordinary scholarship!**So, Tuckwell Scholar students will receive:

- \$22,350 per annum (2021 rate) (increasing with inflation) for each year of the length of their undergraduate degree, to cover on-campus residential costs, books, and general living expenses
- priority access guaranteed to ANU-approved student accommodation
- an annual allowance of up to \$2,000 to assist with their move to Canberra and to support two annual return journeys (e.g., airfares) between their home and the University for each year of their degree. The allowance will be dependent on the proximity of their family home to ANU.
- an allowance to help cover the transport costs for your parents to attend Commencement
 Weekend at the start of the program, and
- an ANU Sports Centre membership for the length of their degree.

Scholarships are awarded based on four criteria:

- academic potential and achievements to date.
- other significant achievements to date, of any type.
- demonstration of the <u>Attributes of a Tuckwell Scholar</u>; and
- a desire to eventually give back to Australia.

Applying for a Tuckwell Scholarship is a three-stage process which commences with an initial application from yourself and a recommendation from a schoolteacher. Applications will begin in March 2022.

University Clinical Aptitude Test

The *University Clinical Aptitude Test (UCAT)* is an admissions test used by the UCAT ANZ Consortium of universities in Australia and New Zealand for their *medical, dental, and clinical science* degree programs. Universities requiring the UCAT are listed at this link - <u>Universities requiring the UCAT</u>. Students intending to apply for courses requiring the UCAT at any of these universities are reminded that they will need to **book a test**.

Bookings will open on 1 March 2022 and close 17 May 2022. The testing dates will be from 1 July 2022 to 12 August 2022.

Students who are preparing for entry into any of these courses are encouraged to familiarise themselves with the **format of the test at <u>UCAT Test Format</u>** and the **practice tests and preparation material** provided at <u>UCAT Preparation</u>.

New Pathways to the Bachelor of **Education Programs**

The Diploma of Teacher Education and Associate Degree of Teacher Education are the new pathways at La Trobe to the Bachelor of Education programs. These pathways replace the Bachelor of Educational Studies. Both pathway courses build the qualifications to transition directly into the second year of the Bachelor of Education (Primary), Bachelor of Education (Secondary) or Bachelor of Early Childhood and Primary Education with full credit.

Restructured Business Degree

The Bachelor of Business will move from a 'tagged' degree (e.g., Bachelor of Business (Marketing)) to a Bachelor of Business and students will choose their major while studying. Students will also have a much larger range of majors and minors to choose from including digital business and international business.

Change to Entry Requirements to **Engineering Degrees**

La Trobe has changed the requirements for the Bachelor of Civil Engineering (Honours) and Bachelor of Engineering Honours (Industrial) with the removal of either Maths Methods or Specialist Maths requirement and replacement with the requirement of any Unit 3 and 4 VCE Mathematics.

Students considering studying *medicine* or dentistry are invited to access the iCanMed website for information about where to study medicine and dentistry, what the entry requirements might be, and all things related to the UCAT test required for most medicine courses. This is an excellent 'go to guide'

Dental Technology and Oral Health Courses in 2022

Dental technicians construct and repair dentures (false teeth) and other dental appliances, including crowns, bridges, and orthodontic appliances (Good Careers Guide)

Oral health therapists diagnose dental decay and gum diseases, work together with dentists to provide routine oral health care for children and adults, and help to promote oral health and preventive dental practices among school children and the broader community (Good Careers Guide)

Both professionals work together with dentists and dental surgeons.

University Snapshot of The Australian National University (ANU) in 2022

- Although the main campus is based in Canberra in the ACT, ANU is Australia's only national university. It has campuses in ACT, NSW, and the NT.
- ANU ranks 1st in Australia and 27th in the world in the <u>QS World University Rankings 2022</u> and ANU counting six Nobel Laureates among its staff and alumni. It also has one of the highest average academic staff to student ratios among Australia's leading universities according to the Good Universities Guide.

Year 10 Work Experience

The official dates of Work Experience are Tuesday 26 – Friday 29 April. The Work Experience program was launched last year during Term 4 at the Bayview campus and a follow up presentation during Head-start to allow students ample time to consider employer contact over the summer break.


All the required Work Experience forms are currently on Compass. They are also accessible on the Williamstown High Careers website under 'Workplace Learning' and 'Required Documents' (the Careers website can be found via School Favourites in Compass or www.willihighcareers.com.au)

During week 2 and 3 of this Term Year 10 students will focus on Work Experience in their period 4 Home group sessions. Students will need to complete the Safe@work General Module module. All students will then be required to submit a copy of the completed certificate too their HGP teacher. Students will also undertake the Specific Industry Safe@Work module in homegroup. It is expected that students have been actively researching, contacting and following up on contact with employers.

Students will need to submit their Work Experience Arrangement Form and the Additional Work experience Covid 19 Form. The Work Experience Travel/Accommodation Form only needs to be completed if the student will travel in a vehicle with the employer. Students and Parents/Carers should be familiar with all prohibited industries and activities that students cannot engage in or undertake for Work Experience.
