WHS School Games – Were these unique to WHS?

There were two games played in the "boys" yard at WHS that may have been unique to WHS:-

Downball

This is the site of the favoured corner for downball. The photo was taken recently (2023). In the 1970s the surface here was asphalt with none of the vegetation (agapanthus, yukkas and eucalypts) and mulch that are there now. You can see the bevelled brick course at the base of the wall that formed the lower limit of the wall for a fair shot.

The game was played with two or more players and involved taking it in turn hitting a ball against a bit of wall. If you failed to make your shot you were "out". The other players continued playing until there was only one person left.

The ball that was used varied. Often it was a beaten up old tennis ball. Sometimes so old that all of the fluff was worn off! In the 1970s there was a type of soft rubber ball that became widely available. It wasn't as hard wearing as the tennis ball but it was certainly softer on your hand. It could also be made to spin prodigiously so could be used to make your opponent work extra hard.

The prime location was a corner of brickwork on the northwest part of the old school building. This had a bevelled course of bricks about 30 cm above ground level that acted as a minimum height level. Your shot had to hit this level of higher. If you hit below it you were out!

The boys toilets were also very close to this and were made of brickwork as well. They were therefore in play especially when you were using the soft rubber balls. They travelled a long way. The ground between them was all asphalt so the game was an all-weather sport.

Geoff Van Wyngaarden remembers: "This is the former legendary DOWNBALL corner where singles and doubles World Titles were held in the 1970's...This happened over many years. Sadly this corner is now a vegetation area. A group of up to 12 boys would play and chalk marks written on the asphalt was where the scoring was done. First boy out received one point, the next boy out 2 points etc. The ball had to go above a certain brick mark to stay in the competition. In doubles each player took turns in order to try and eliminate the next player etc....Players who were good would hit the ball towards the side of the wall either hard or soft to try and catch the next person in the worst possible position so that they would probably be eliminated.

Gutterball

This game was made possible by the construction of drainage gutters that ran across various parts of the school grounds. These were needed because the vast majority of the school yard was asphalt in the 1970s and controlling the rainfall runoff was essential.

The type of gutter installed was a Public Works Department standard profile that was common across many schools. It was certainly present at Williamstown Primary School #1183 at the time. This game was played at that school as well.


It was usually played by two players standing on opposite sides of the gutter. The objective was to throw your ball so that it struck the sloping side of the gutter. The ball then bounced back and you caught it. You continued your turn until you missed. If your throw missed the gutter slope or you failed to catch it on return - then the ball went to the other player who then had a go.

There were various ways of scoring.

You could set a target, say 10 in a row, then the first person to get a streak of 10 in a row would be the winner.

You could set a cumulative total, say 50, then keep your score as you took turns to see who could get to the total soonest.

You could take the changing distance approach. You started one pace away from the gutter. After you get 10 in a row you then went back another pace and took all your throws from there. It got much harder the further away from the gutter you got. The winner was the person who was furthest away when the game stopped- usually when the bell went!



Geoff Van Wyngaarden remembers: GUTTERBALL is also now extinct because the very long concrete gutter has been totally removed. Each boy would stand an equal distance either side of the gutter and throw the ball towards the gutter and catch the rebound.
