My Career Insights Journey: Year 9 students



Phase 1: Discover

Students complete a series of online questions on the Morrisby website.

Phase 2: Develop

After student Morrisby profiling, students will be able to discuss their results with a Morrisby trained Careers Consultant. This discussion will be face-to-face at school or through a video conference in term 3 during week 2 depending on restrictions.



My Career Insights is a program for all Year 9 students in Victorian Government secondary schools. The Department of Education and Training (DET) has engaged the Career Education Association of Victoria (CEAV), which is working with Career Analysts Pty Ltd, to deliver My Career Insights.

Year 9 students will undertake the Morrisby assessment on **Thursday 24 June** during Home group, period 1-3 with a break at recess. **Students should make sure they have fully charged devices.** Students will benefit from this experience and gain insights into career pathways.

Morrisby Profile is a test battery developed specifically for careers guidance. It is composed of 12 tests, 8 measuring abilities and 4 measuring talents, motivation, personality and work preferences. Together these provide an objective view of the students' talents as they relate to work. The timed tests include:

- Verbal Reasoning
- Numerical Reasoning
- Abstract Reasoning
- Mechanical Reasoning
- Spatial Reasoning

In addition, untimed questionnaires measuring:

- Career Interests
- Personality Type
- Study Interests

Year 9 students will prepare for their Morrisby in their Home group lessons and undertake practice questions as well as watching a clip about the Morrisby profile. See

School Leavers Support

The National Careers Institute, at the Department of Education, Skills and Employment, has established the School Leavers initiative to help support school leavers aged 15-24 transitioning from school into a career pathway.

The transition from school can be challenging, and the COVID-19 pandemic has presented some uncertainty resulting in a changed education and workforce landscape. The service has been established to help school leavers easily find the information they need to support their decisions while deciding on their next steps as well as provide additional support through their qualified career practitioners if needed.
